**ROLLCALL BY VILLAGE CLERK PATRICIA OLSEN.**

**ALL PRESENT.**

**MAYOR DWYER STATED HE RECEIVED AN EMAIL REGARDING THE GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY PLAN WHICH EVERYONE HERE WATCHED US CREATE OVER SEVERAL YEARS. WE RECEIVED NOTICE THAT OUR PLAN WAS ACCEPTED FOR PROCESSING SO WE HAVE MET OUR REQUIREMENTS FOR THE RESIDENTS TO GET A TAX REBATE OF ANY INCREASE IN TAXES. WE ALSO HAD TO STAY BELOW THE TAX CAP, WHICH WE DID.**

**CORRESPONDENCE**

**LETTER RECEIVED FROM THE CITY OF PORT JERVIS – REGARDING OUR HIGH SALES TAX AND A PROPOSAL FOR BORDER STATES FOR A MORE COMPETITIVE SALES TAX RATE FOR BORDER TOWNS. GREENWOOD LAKE WOULD FALL WITHIN ONE OF THESE BORDER CATEGORIES AND SALES TAX WOULD BE REDUCED IN ORDER TO MAKE YOUR BUSINESS MORE COMPETITIVE. NEW YORK STATE WOULD MANDATE THAT THE COUNTY PORTION OF THE SALES TAX WOULD BE CUT IN HALF. NEW YORK STATE WOULD NEED TO ELIMINATE SALES TAX ON MEDICINE, CLOTHING. NEW YORK STATE WOULD NEED TO LOWER THE GAS EXCISE TAX BY ½ FOR THOSE BUSINESSES WITHIN 4 MILES OF ANOTHER STATE. THE BOARD DISCUSSED THIS AT OUR WORKSHOP AND WE SUPPORT THIS WHOLEHEARTEDLY.**

**VISITING ELECTED OFFICIALS**

**COUNCILMAN FLOYD DEANGELO – WE HAD A VERY SUCCESSFUL OPENING OF WOODLANDS PARK IN WARWICK. WE ARE WORKING ON THE BUDGET.**

**BUILDING DEPARTMENT REPORT BY DODY NICHOLAS**

**FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2015 THE BUILDING DEPARTMENT ISSUED 70 ORDER TO REMEDIES,,, 24 BUILDING PERMITS, 23 CC/CO'S, SENT 96 SEPTIC LETTERS, 12 EXPIRED BUILDNG PERMIT LETTERS, 22 RENTAL INSPECTION LETTERS, 12 FIRE INSPECTION LETTERS, DID 28 RENTAL INSPECTIONS, 4 CMMERCIAL FIRE INSPECTIONS AND 14 MUNICIPAL SEARCHES. I ALSO ATTENDED 1 PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD MEETING. I ALSO PRESENTED THE BOARD WITH A RENEWAL OF A BUILDING PERMIT REQUEST WHICH NEEDS TO HAVE BOARD APPROVAL AS IT IS THE SECOND RENEWAL.**

**DISCUSSION REGARDING PROGRESS ON THE WORK BEING DONE.**

**DPW    REPORTED BY DEPUTY COMMISSIONER BEN ASTORINO**

**WE CLEANED OUT SOME CATCH BASINS ON HUMPHREY, STERLING AND TENEYCK. FALL IS COMING AND LEAVES ARE FALLING SO WE ARE ASKING RESIDENTS TO TRY AND KEEP THE BASINS NEAR THEM CLEAR. WE PAVED HUMPHREY ROAD. WE PATCHED POTHOLES AROUND THE VILLAG, ROAD SIGNS AND VEHICLE MAINTENANCE AS NEEDED. WE ALSO WORKED WITH PHIL ON SOME WATER ISSUES.**

**POLICE                REPORTED BY CHIEF JOHN HANSEN**

**THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HANDLED 1415 COMPLAINTS IN THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER. WE ISSUED 225 CITATIONS, MADE 22 ARRESTS, INVESTIGATED 7 MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS, HANDLED 17 NAVIGATION COMPLAINTS AND ISSUED 5 NAVIGATION TICKETS.**

**MAYOR DWYER STATED WE DISCUSSED THE HALLOWEEN CURFEW.**

**JUSTICE COURT                REPORTED BY JUSTICE KEITH GARLEY**

**THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER WAS A VERY BUSY MONTH FOR THE COURT WE OPENED 208 NEW FILES WITH 178 DEFENDANTS. WE CLOSED OUT 188 CASES ON 244 CHARGES. WE ADDED A SECOND VTL COURT TO DEAL WITH A BACKLOG. WE GOT OUR JCAP APPLICATION GRANT IN A MONTH EARLY SO WE ARE HOPING TO GET THAT MONEY FROM THE STATE.**

**WATER                REPORTED BY PHIL LANDRU**

**WE ARE WAITING FOR THE RESULTS OF THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENTS ANNUAL INSPECTION. WE HAVE REPAIRED NUMEROUS LEAKS AND SERVICE LINE PROBLEM IN THE VILLAGE WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE TOWN OF WARWICK DPW. WE HAVE ALSO BEEN BUSY WITH WATER METERING ISSUES AS WELL.**

**AS EVERYONE IS WELL AWARE OF BY NOW, THE VILLAGE HAS SENT OUT NOTICES THAT LEAD HAS BEEN DETECTED AT LEVELS WHICH THE COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT DETERMINES TO REQUIRE MORE FREQUENT TESTING. THE VILLAGE WATER TREATMENT FACILITY IS NOT PRODUCING WATER WITH LEAD IN IT. OUT OF THE 45 SAMPLES THAT WERE TAKEN THROUGHOUT THE VILLAGE, ONLY THREE SAMPLES CAME IN OVER THE ALLOWABLE LIMIT FOR LEAD. TWO OF THEM ONLY EXCEEDED THE LIMIT BY A FEW HUNDREDTHS OF A MILLIGRAM PER LITER. THE STATE IS FINDING A TREND NOW WITH LEAD AND COPPER ISSUES DUE TO THE DEC'S PROBLEM WITH ANY KIND OF PHOSPHATES BEING USED DUE TO THEIR IMPACT ON THE ENVIRONMENT. PHOSPHATES HAVE BEEN THE REMEDY FOR CORROSION ISSUES FOR DECADES NOW. AS AN OPERATOR, I HAVE TO QUESTION THIS AGENCY ENVIRONMENTAL PRIORITIES TAKING PRECEDENT OVER THE SAFETY OF OUR DRINKING WATER. ALONG WITH THE WATER QUALITY PROBLEMS THAT PHOSPHATE REMOVAL HAVE PRODUCED AS WELL. THE VILLAGE BOARD HAS TAKEN THE NECESSARY ACTIONS IN ADDRESSING THIS ISSUE WITH AN IMMEDIATE AND THOROUGH SYSTEM FLUSH AND IS WORKING CLOSELY WITH A CHEMICAL EXPERT, THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND OUR WATER DEPARTMENT TO TAKE THE BEST COURSE OF ACTION GOING FORWARD. A DESK TOP STUDY IS BEING DONE BASED ON THOROUGH DATA COLLECTION FROM OUR WATER DEPARTMENT TO ADDRESS THE CORROSION ISSUE. THE SAMPLE SITES ARE ALSO BEING RETESTED AS WELL. WE ALSO FEEL THAT IT IS WORTH MENTIONING THAT THE GREENWOOD LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL CONDUCTED THEIR OWN PRIVATE STUDY AND THOSE LAB RESULTS CONCLUDED THAT THE SCHOOLS WATER WAS SAFE FOR DRINKING. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE FEEL FREE TO SPEAK WITH ME DIRECTLY.**

**MAYOR DWYER – DO YOU KNOW WHEN WE WILL HAVE THE RESULTS OF THE RESAMPLING?**

**PHIL LANDRU - I STILL HAVE FIVE MORE TO TAKE UP AND THE RESULTS ARE USUALLY BACK WITHIN TWO WEEKS.**

**MAYOR DWYER – WE TESTED SOME SITES WHERE WATER IS NOT USED THAT FREQUENTLY AND IT SITS IN THE PIPES. IF THE WATER TESTS ARE UNDER THE MINIMUM LEVELS WE WON'T HAVE TO KEEP DOING MAILINGS. I JUST WANT TO REITERATE THAT THERE IS NO LEAD IN THE VILLAGE WATER SUPPLY.**

**PHIL LANDRU – THAT'S CORRECT IT IS CORROSION THAT IS TAKING PLACE IN CERTAIN HOMES. FOR DECADES PHOSPHATES HAVE KEPT THE LEVELS UNDER CONTROL BUT THE DEC HAS FORBIDDEN THEIR USE SO IT IS CAUSING PROBLEMS. I THINK WE SHOULD APPROACH THE DEC WITH THIS AS A HEALTH AND SAFETY ISSUE WHICH SHOULD TAKE PRECEDENCE OVER AN ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUE.**

**MAYOR DWYER – TRUSTEE HOLDER BROUGHT UP THAT A GROUP OF SCOUTS WOULD LIKE TO HELP WITH PAINTING HYDRANTS AND INSTALLING THE FLAGS ON TOP FOR THE WINTER.**

**AMBULANCE CORP    REPORTED BY NANCY BRENNER DEANGELO**

**FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, THE AMBULANCE CORP HANDLED 41 CALLS WHICH IS 411 FOR THE YEAR. WE HAD MVA'S, BURNS, TRAUMA. DIFFICULTY BREATHING, CHEST PAIN, EDP, OVERDOSE, ALLERGIC REACTIONS. HEMORRHAGING, LOSS OF**

**CONSCIOUSNESS, ONE DOA, FIVE STAND BY'S. I WOULD RECOMMEND TO EVERYONE TO GET A FLU SHOT THIS YEAR WHICH COVERS BOTH A AND B THIS YEAR. IS THERE ANYTHING THAT THE VILLAGE CAN DO FOR THE CITIZENS THAT CANNOT PUT IN A METER IN THEIR HOMES. DOES THE COMPANY THAT INSTALLS THEM OFFER PLUMBING. I AM SEEING A LOT OF HOMES WITH WATER BILLS THAT ARE PRETTY HIGH AND THE HOMES HAVEN'T BEEN USED IN A LONG TIME.**

**VILLAGE CLERK PAT OLSEN – THERE AR 72 CUSTOMERS THAT ARE STILL FLAT BECAUSE THEY HAVE PLUMBING ISSUES THAT WONT ALLOW A METER TO BE PUT IN. THE CUSTOMERS WOULD HAVE TO REPLUMB THEIR HOUSES IN ORDER FOR A METER TO FIT, OR THE PIPES ARE IN AN ENCLOSED WALL.**

**MAYOR DWYER – UNFORTUNATELY, THE BURDEN IS ON THE RESIDENT TO ENSURE THE PLUMBING IS SUFFICIENT FOR A METER TO BE INSTALLED.**

**NANCY DEANGELO – SO THEY HAVE TO SPEND THE MONEY TO INSTALL THE METER?**

**TRUSTEE HOWLEY – THEY HAVE TO MAKE THEIR PIPES ACCESSIBLE. WHEN THIS FIRST HAPPENED I HAD TO CUT A HOLE IN MY WALL IN ORDER TO INSTALL A METER. I FRAMED IT OUT NEATLY.**

**VILLAGE CLERK PAT OLSEN – THE COST OF THE METER ITSELF IS \$380.00 WHICH EVERYONE THAT HAD A METER INSTALLED PAID. THOSE THAT COULDN'T INSTALL THE METER DIDN'T PAY FOR IT. A LOT OF PEOPLE DON'T WANT TO SPEND THAT MONEY.**

**MAYOR DWYER – IT IS A TRADE OFF.**

**VILLAGE CLERK PAT OLSEN – THE BILL IS 255.00 PLUS THE FILTRATION PLANT CHARGES WHICH COMOES TO 380.00 TOTAL.**

#### **TRUSTEE REPORTS**

##### **TRUSTEE HOLDER-**

**I HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT EVERYONE WATCH THE LIVE STREAM ON THE SCHOOL BOARDS WEBSITE IFYOU HAVENT MADE IT TO THE MEETINGS. THEY ARE TALKING ABOUT SPENDING THE FUNDS THAT WERE SET ASIDE FOR A HIGH SCHOOL AND IT WILL BE GOING OUT TO PUBLIC VOTE OVER WHETHER THEY CAN USE THOSE FUNDS OR MUST GIVE THEM BACK. THEY HAVE COVERED TWO HOUR BLOCKS AT THE MEETINGS OVER WHAT THEY WANT TO DO.**

**VILLAGE CLERK PAT OLSEN – WHEN WILL THE VOTE BE?**

**TRUSTEE HOLDER – THEY ARE LOOKING INTO THAT RIGHT NOW.**

**TRUSTEE CHAD SELLIER – IS THERE ANYTHING IN PRINT AVAILABLE TO LOOK AT?**

**TRUSTEE HOLDER – YES ON THE WEBSITE. THEY ARE LOOKING AT THREE DIFFERENT SCENERIO'S. PRIORITY IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS FIRST. NO ONE REALLY GOES TO THE MEETINGS ANYMORE EXCEPT THE TEACHERS. THIS IS A LOT OF MONEY. THEY ARE TALKING ABOUT A POSSIBLE 17% INCREASE IN TAXES. THEY ARE STILL UNDECISIVE ON WHAT THEY WANT TO DO.**

**LIBRARY – THEY ARE STILL HAVING KIDS MOVIE NIGHTS ON TUESDAY AND GAME NIGHTS ON WEDNESDAY. THERE ARE A LOT OF PROGRAMS COMING UP FOR THE FALL THAT YOU CAN CHECK OUT ONLINE OR AT THE LIBRARY.**

**THE GWL COALTION IS LOOKING FOR HALLOWEEN DECORATIONS IF YOU HAVE ANY EXTRA AND THEY ARE ALSO LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS FOR THE TEEN CENTER. THE SAME THREE PEOPLE HAVE BEEN VOLUNTEERING FOR THE LAST FEW YEARS. THEY HAVE ANYWHERE FROM 25 TO 40 KIDS EACH WEEK. THEY NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS TO HELP OUT.**

**THE PBA HAS BEEN VERY INVOLVED WITH THE COMMUNITY. THEY RAN A GOLF OUTING AND THEY GET INVOLVED WITH HALLOWEEN AND I URGE EVERYONE TO SUPPORT THEM.**

## **TRUSTEE SELLIER REPORT**

**FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER THERE WAS A PLANNING AND ZONING BOARD MEETING. BOTH HAD SINGLE APPLICANTS THAT WERE ADJOURNED TO OCTOBER. THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMMITTEE IS SET TO MEET ON OCTOBER 26<sup>TH</sup> TO CONTINUE THEIR WORK. THE DOG PARK IS NOW OPEN TO THE PUBLIC. IT IS BEING RUN BY A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION CALLED BARKPARK, INC. THEY ARE PLANNING A GRAND OPENING CELEBRATION FOR NOVEMBER 7<sup>TH</sup> AT 1:00PM TO DEDICATE THE COMMEMORATIVE BRICK PATH AND TO SHOW OUR APPRECIATION TO THE VOLUNTEERS WHO DONATE THEIR TIME. ## **ATTORNEY BUCKHEIT REPORT**

**AT THE LAST BOARD MEETING THERE WAS A PROPERTY OWNER COMPLAINING ABOUT A WATER LEAK AND WE PROMISED THEM WE WOULD LOOK INTO IT. THE MAYOR AND I BOTH VISITED THE PROPERTY AND SPOKE TO ADJACENT PROPERTY OWNERS AND WERE ABLE TO WORK OUT A SOLUTION. WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO BRING YOUR ISSUES TO THE MAYOR AND VILLAGE BOARD.**

## **VILLAGE CLERK REPORT BY PATRICIA OLSEN**

**THIS IS THE LAST WEEK TO COLLECT WATER BILLS WITHOUT PENALTY. IF YOU HAVEN'T RECEIVED IT OR ARE HAVING DIFFICULTY PAYING IT WE WILL WORK WITH YOU TO COME UP WITH A PAYMENT PLAN.**

## **OLD BUSINESS**

**LEAD & COPPER – WE HAVE GONE OVER HIS ISSUE, SENT LETTERS TO ALL THE WATER CUSTOMERS, PUT IT ON THE WEBSITE AND FACEBOOK. THE VILLAGE IS NOT SUPPLYING WATER THAT HAS LEAD IN IT. LEAD ISSUES ARE COMING FROM OLDER HOMES THAT HAVE LEAD SOLDER HOLDING THEIR PIPES TOGETHER. LEAD USED TO BE USED IN SOLDER BEFORE THE MID 80S. WE DO USE CHLORINE IN OUR WATER AND THAT DOES CORRODE OVER TIME. WE SWAPPED OUT TWO OF THE ADDRESSES THAT WERE OVER THE ALLOWABLE LEVELS, THE VILLAGE HALL AND THE DPW. THE FINAL RESULTS FOR THE RETEST SHOULD BE WITHIN THE NEXT COUPLE OF WEEKS. WE ANTICIPATE THE TESTS WILL HAVE LOWER LEVELS. WE ARE WAITING FOR A COMPLETED DESKTOP STUDY ON HOW WE CAN MAKE OUR WATER LESS CORROSIVE.**

**COYOTES – MAYOR DWYER STATED I HAVE GOTTEN SEVERAL REPORTS OF COYOTES COMING INTO RESIDENTIAL AREAS IN THE VILLAGE IN LAKELANDS AND DOWN IN FOREST PARK. WE WANTED TO BE PROACTIVE AND MET WITH THE DEC AS WELL AS THE MANAGER OF STERLING FOREST PARK JUST TO GET THEIR FEEDBACK ON THE NUMBER OF COYOTES IN THE AREA. WE FOUND THERE IS A HIGHER NUUMBER IN THE PARK THAN USUAL, AND THEY ARE LOOKING FOR EASIER FOOD SUPPLIES AND ENTERING NEIGHBORHOODS. WE WILL CONTINUE TO KEEP AN EYE ON THE SITUATION TO SEE IF ANY FURTHER ACTION IS NEEDED.**

**PART TIME POLICE CONTRACT – AT THE LAST BOARD MEETING WE DISCUSSED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNION AND VOTED TO APPROVE THE CONTRACT. IT WAS A COMPLEX AGREEMENT THAT WAS TWO YEARS BEHIND. WE WENT TO MEDIATION AND BASICALLY NOTHING WAS APPROVED FOR THOSE TWO YEARS AND THEY WERE CLOSED OUT AND WE STARTED NEGOTIATING A CONTRACT FOR THE NEXT THREE YEARS. WE AS A VILLAGE BOARD HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO OUR TAXPAYERS BUT ALSO TO OUR EMPLOYEES. WE OFFERED THEM NO RETRO, BUT STARTING THIS YEAR WE OFFERED THEM A .75 CENT RAISE, .50 CENT FOR THE SECOND YEAR, AND .50 CENT FOR THE THIRD YEAR. THIS WORKS OUT TO SLIGHTLY MORE THAN 1% A YEAR OVER THE FIVE YEARS. WE ALSO AGREED TO MAKE SURE THAT ALL OFFICERS WOULD HAVE UNEXPIRED BULLETPROOF VESTS FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY. WE REQUESTED A MINIMUM AVAILABILITY FROM THE PART TIME OFFICERS EACH MONTH. IT HELPS US ALLEVIATE OVERTIME BY THE FULL TIME OFFICERS. IT HAS WORKED OUT WELL SO FAR AND ALLOWS US TO SCHEDULE OUT A FEW MONTHS IN ADVANCE.**

**O&R RATES – MAYOR DWYER STATED THE PUBLIC SERVIC COMMISSION HAS AGREED TO A RATE INCREASE FOR BOTH ELECTRIC AND GAS THAT WILL TAKE EFFECT NOVEMBER 1<sup>ST</sup> FOR ALL CUSTOMERS. ELECTRIC WILL BE INCREASED 1.4% AND GAS WILL BE INCREASED 7.3%. I RECOMMEND EACH USER CONTACT ANOTHER DELIVERY AGENT TO CHECK ON THEIR RATES. WE LOCKED IN EARLY AND OUR RATE IS PHENOMENAL.**

## **NEW BUSINESS**

**APPOINTMENT OF ETHAN FORCHETTE TO ZBA - MAYOR DWYER STATED TOM TUTHILL IS RESIGNING FROM THE BOARD AS HE IS MOVING OUTSIDE OF THE VILLAGE. ETHAN IS ALREADY THE ALTERNATIVE BOARD MEMBER SO WE WILL BE APPOINTING HIM TO BE A FULL MEMBER OF THE BOARD.**

**TWO WATER BILL COMPLAINTS – MAYOR DWYER STATED SINCE WE HAVE INSTALLED THE NEW METER CAPS WE HAVE BEEN GETTING AN OCCASIONAL CALL FROM RESIDENTS NOTING UNUSUAL USAGE WHICH HAS HELPED TO IDENTIFY LEAKS. WE HAVE HAD SEVERAL ISSUES AND WE WOULD LIKE TO REDUCE THE WATER USAGE CHARGES TO HALF FOR THESE CUSTOMERS.**

**BUILDING PERMIT RENEWAL – MAYOR DWYER STATED THE BUILDING INSPECTOR WAS APPROACHED FOR A SECOND RENEWAL OF A BUILDING PERMIT WHICH HAS TO NOW COME BEFORE THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL.**

**DOG PARK LEASE AGREEMENT – DURING THE WORKSHOP WE WENT THROUGH MOST OF THIS LEASE. WE ARE LEASING THE PROPERTY TO THE BARK PARK FOR \$1.00 PER MONTH WHICH IS A NON PROFIT. HOPEFULLY BY OUR NEXT MEETING WE WILL HAVE A LEASE AGREEMENT.**

**PORT JERVIS TAX PROPOSAL – MAYOR DWYER STATED WE DISCUSSED THIS ALREADY.**

**HGTV FILMING - THEY WILL BE FILMING THE SHOW HOUSE HUNTERS IN THE VILLAGE OF GREENWOOD LAKE AT THE END OF OCTOBER. I WOULD ENCOURAGE ALL HOMEOWNERS AND BUSINESSES ON WINDERMERE AVE AND THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY TO MAKE SURE YOUR PROPERTY LOOKS ITS BEST. I WANT TO THANK SUE ONDERDUNK FROM BETTER HOMES REALTY FOR ENCOURAGING THEM TO COME HERE TO FILM.**
